

## CHAPTER 56—H. F. No. 19.

*An Act to appropriate money to pay deficiencies in aid to high schools, graded schools, semi-graded schools and rural schools for the two fiscal years ending July 31, 1905, and July 31, 1906.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That the following sums be and the same are hereby appropriated out of the funds in the state treasury of Minnesota, not otherwise appropriated, for the following purposes:

**\$52,000 high school deficiency appropriation.**—Fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) for deficiency aid to high schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1905.

**\$76,000 high school deficiency appropriation.**—Seventy-six thousand dollars (\$76,000) for deficiency aid to high schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1906.

**\$3,700 graded school deficiency appropriation.**—Three thousand seven hundred dollars (\$3,700) for deficiency aid to graded schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1905.

**\$3,600 graded school deficiency appropriation.**—Three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600) for deficiency aid to graded schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1906.

**\$5,510 semi-graded school deficiency appropriation.**—Five thousand five hundred and ten dollars (\$5,510) for deficiency aid to semi-graded schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1905.

**\$10,506 semi-graded school deficiency appropriation.**—Ten thousand five hundred and six dollars (\$10,506) for deficiency aid to semi-graded schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1906.

**\$32,010 first-class rural school deficiency appropriation.**—Thirty-two thousand and ten dollars (\$32,010) for deficiency aid to first-class rural schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1905.

**\$54,700 first-class rural school deficiency appropriation.**—Fifty-four thousand seven hundred dollars (\$54,700) for deficiency aid to first-class rural schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1906.

**\$3,237 deficiency aid to second-class rural schools.**—Three thousand two hundred and thirty-seven dollars (\$3,237) for deficiency aid to second-class rural schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1905.

**\$9,840 deficiency aid to second-class rural schools.**—Nine thousand eight hundred and forty dollars (\$9,840) for deficiency aid to second-class rural schools for the fiscal year ending July 31, 1906.

**Available Sept. 19, 1907.**—All of said appropriations to be available in the month of September, 1907, to be used and expended under and pursuant to the provisions of chapter 142, Laws of 1905.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 57—H. F. No. 543.

*An Act entitled, "An act to authorize any city in this state now or hereafter having a population of over fifty thousand inhabitants to acquire, construct, use and maintain, with suitable grounds, an auditorium building, and to levy necessary taxes therefor, and to confirm previous acts of such cities in that regard."*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Auditorium board to be appointed by mayor.**—Section 1. That any city in this state now or hereafter having a population of over fifty thousand inhabitants shall have the power and authority, acting by and through its common council, to acquire construct, own, maintain and use an auditorium building, with necessary grounds, suitable for the accommodation of large gatherings of people on public occasions, and to levy and collect the necessary taxes therefor. The mayor of any such city which has acquired and constructed, or which may desire to acquire or construct, any such auditorium building shall forthwith appoint five resident freeholders of such city as an auditorium board, whose term of office shall be, respectively, for one, two, three, four and five years and until their successors are appointed and qualified,
