

CHAPTER 270—S. F. No. 390.

An Act to amend section 4950 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota, 1905, relating to crime against nature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Punishment for crime against nature.—Section 1. That section 4950, of the Revised Laws of Minnesota, 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

“4950. Crime against nature—Every person who shall commit the crime against nature with mankind or beast, or attempt sexual intercourse with a dead body, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than twenty years, and any sexual penetration, however slight, shall be sufficient to complete the crime.”

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 271—S. F. No. 489.

An Act to amend subdivision 4 of section 2699 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota for the year 1905, relating to fees of coroners.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Physicians to receive \$6.00 per day and mileage.—Section 1. That subdivision 4 of section 2699 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota for the year 1905 be amended so as to read as follows:

“4. Physicians called by the coroner to make autopsies shall be allowed six (6) dollars per day and mileage as above, and, when the county board shall be satisfied that the autopsy was attended by great and unusual difficulties, they may allow such further sum to the physicians as may be just compensation for the services.

This act shall apply to all counties now having or hereafter having a population of less than 275,000, but shall not apply to any county where such fees are now fixed by special laws.”

Sec. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
