## CHAPTER 314-H. F. No. 495.

An Act to appropriate money to reimburse Engebret E. Lobeck for his expenses incurred in the contest of his election as a member of the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota for the term commencing in January, 1909.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

\$304.11 to E. E. Lobeck for election contest expenses.—Section 1. That the sum of three hundred and four and eleven-one hundredths dollars (\$304.11) be, and the same is, hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated to be paid to the said Engebret E. Lobeck to reimburse him for his expenses, including attorney's fees, incurred in the contest for his seat as a member of the house of representatives of the state of Minnesota for the term commencing in January, 1909.

That a warrant for said sum be drawn by the state auditor upon the state treasurer in favor of the said Engebret E. Lobeck.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 315-H. F. No. 496.

An Act to appropriate money to reimburse James A. Carley for his expenses incurred in the contest of his election as a member of the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota for the term commencing in January, 1909.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

\$314.65 to James A. Carley for election contest expenses.—Section 1. That the sum of three hundred fourteen and sixty-five-one-hundredths dollars (\$314.65) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to be paid to James A. Carley to reimburse him for his expenses incurred, including attorney's fees in the contest for his seat as a member of the house of representatives of the state of Minnesota for the term commencing in January, 1909. That a warrant for said sum be drawn by the state auditor upon the state treasurer in favor of the said James A. Carley.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
