A person of full age may be adopted.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 458—H. F. No. 825.

*An Act to amend Section One Thousand Four Hundred and Fourteen (1414) of Chapter Fourteen (14) of the Revised Laws of 1905, relating to school taxes.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Tax levy for school purposes.**—Section 1. That section one thousand four hundred and fourteen (1414) of chapter fourteen (14) of the Revised Laws of 1905 be amended so as to read as follows:

In common districts such district school tax shall not exceed fifteen mills on the dollar for the support of the schools, or ten mills for the purchase of school sites and the erection and equipment of school houses; but in such districts in which such ten-mill tax will not produce six hundred dollars, a greater tax may be levied for school sites and buildings, not to exceed twenty-five mills on the dollar, nor six hundred dollars in amount. In common districts having less than ten voters the district school tax shall not exceed four hundred dollars. In independent districts no tax in excess of eight mills on the dollar shall be levied for the purchase of school sites and the erection of school houses. In special districts such amounts may be levied as may be allowed by special law at the time when the Revised Laws take effect.
