CHAPTER 172-H. F. No. 690.

An Act authorizing the transfer from the state of Minnesota to the city of Faribault of all the right, title and interest of the former in and to west half of block six of the original town (now city) of Faribault, Rice county, Minnesota.

Whereas, the state of Minnesota is now the owner of the west one-half of block 6 of the original town (now city) of Faribault, Rice county, Minnesota, said land belonging to the Minnesota State School for the Deaf and Dumb at said Faribault, having been purchased by the state for said school from one Hudson Wilson and wife by quit claim deed for the sum of \$200.00 dated December 1, 1881, and duly recorded in the office of the register of deeds of Rice county, Minnesota, in Book 29 of Deeds on page 573, and

WHEREAS, said west half of block 6, is isolated and separated from the grounds of said Deaf and Dumb School and is not used by said institution and is of no value or benefit to said school or to the state, and

WHEREAS, said land is low land lying along the river bottom of Straight river in said city, and

WHEREAS, said city of Faribault is desirous of purchasing said land for use of said city as a dumping ground, and

WHEREAS, it seems to be for the best interest of the state to sell and dispose of said land, now therefore, Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. State to convey certain land to city of Faribault.—That upon the payment into the state treasury by the city of Faribault of the sum of two hundred dollars, the governor of the state is hereby authorized and instructed to execute and acknowledge in behalf of the state, a deed of conveyance to the said city of Faribault as grantee, of all the right, title and interest of the state of Minnesota in, and to the said land and premises, and is hereby authorized to deliver said deed to said city, and the said city of Faribault is hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate for such payment out of any available moneys in the city treasury of such city, the said sum of two hundred dollars and is authorized and empowered to accept and receive such deed.
