

CHAPTER 521—H. F. No. 399.

An Act to prohibit the sale of tickets to public entertainments at a greater price than the same are sold for by the management thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Prohibiting theatre ticket scalping.**—No person, firm, or corporation shall sell or offer or expose for sale any tickets of admission to any theatre, opera, concert, athletic contest, or other public entertainment at a greater price than the same are being sold for or offered for sale by the management of the same.

Sec. 2. **Penalty for violation.**—Violation of this act shall be punishable by a fine of not less than ten (10) dollars or more than one hundred (100) dollars, or imprisonment in the county jail for not less than ten (10) days or more than ninety (90) days.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 522—H. F. No. 414.

An Act fixing the times of holding general terms of the district court in the eleventh judicial district of Minnesota.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Terms of court in 11th judicial district.**—The general terms of the district court shall be held each year in the several counties constituting the eleventh judicial district of Minnesota at the times herein prescribed as follows:

Carlton county—Second Tuesday in February, first Tuesday in June, third Tuesday in October.

St. Louis county—First Wednesday in January, March, May, September and November.

Lake county—First Wednesday in June and December.

Cook county—Third Monday in June.

Sec. 2. **Not to affect the Virginia and Hibbing provisions.**—Nothing contained in this act shall affect Chapter 126 of the General Laws of the state of Minnesota for the year 1909, providing among other things for the holding of general terms of the district court at the city of Virginia and for the adjournment thereof to the village of Hibbing.

Sec. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after June 1st, 1913.
