

CHAPTER 149—S. F. No. 802.

An act to reimburse the official reporter of the district court of the eighteenth judicial district for amounts paid out for railway traveling and hotel expenses while absent from his place of residence in the discharge of his official duties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. 18th judicial district court reporters allowed traveling expenses while absent from residence on official duty.—The official reporter of the district court of the eighteenth judicial district of the state shall be paid, in addition to the amounts now provided by law, all sums he shall hereafter pay out as necessary railway, traveling and hotel expenses while absent from his place of residence in the discharge of his official duties.

Such expenses shall be paid by the respective counties in the same proportions as the salary of such reporter is paid, upon presentation of a verified and itemized statement of the reporter therefor, duly approved by the judge of said court, to the county auditor, whereupon the auditor shall issue his warrant in payment thereof.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 150—H. F. No. 678.

An act to amend Subdivision 12, Section 294, General Statutes of Minnesota for 1913, fixing salaries in state treasurer's office.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. Increase of salaries of various employes in the office of state treasurer.—That subdivision 12, section 294, General Statutes of Minnesota for 1913, be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 294—12, office of state treasurer.

State treasurer, forty-five hundred dollars; deputy state treasurer, twenty-seven hundred dollars; accountant, twenty-one hundred dollars; cashier, twenty-one hundred dollars; investment clerk, eighteen hundred dollars; check clerk, eighteen hundred dollars, stenographers and general clerks, such sum as the treasurer shall prescribe, not exceeding in all forty-seven hundred dollars.
