Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 459—H. F. No. 1072.

An act to amend Subdivision 1, Section 1, Chapter 400, General Laws of Minnesota, 1913, to fix the salaries of certain state officers and employees.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Salary of executive messenger increased.**—That subdivision 1, section 1, chapter 400, Laws of Minnesota, 1913, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The yearly salaries of the state officers and employees mentioned in this act shall be as herein fixed and all salaries shall be payable in monthly installments.

1. OFFICE OF GOVERNOR.

Governor, seven thousand dollars; private secretary, forty-five hundred dollars; executive clerk, three thousand dollars; recording clerk, twelve hundred dollars; executive messenger, fifteen hundred dollars; stenographer, twelve hundred dollars.

CHAPTER 460—H. F. No. 1110.

An act to fix salaries of aldermen in cities of Minnesota now or hereafter having over 50,000 inhabitants and not governed under a charter adopted pursuant to Chapter 36, Article 4, of the State Constitution.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Minneapolis aldermen to receive salary of \$1,800 per annum.**—That in cities now or hereafter having a population of over fifty thousand inhabitants and not governed under a charter adopted under and pursuant to section 36, article 4 of the state constitution, the salary of each alderman shall be eighteen hundred dollars per annum, payable pro rata monthly out of the city treasury.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after May 1st, 1917.
