CHAPTER 473-H. F. No. 404.

An act to amend Chapter 144 of the General Laws of Minnesota, for the year 1915, fixing the salaries, compensation and help of the county assessor in counties having or which may be reafter have a population of not less than two hundred thousand (200,000) and less than two hundred seventy-five thousand (275,000) and providing for the payment thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary of assessor of Ramsey county.—Section 1 of chapter 144 of the General Laws of Minnesota, for the year 1915, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The salary of the county assessor of each county of this state, having, or which may hereafter have a population of not less than two hundred thousand (200,000) inhabitants and less than two hundred seventy-five (275,000) inhabitants, shall be four thousand two hundred and fifty dollars (\$4,250.00) per annum.

- Sec. 2. Salary of chief deputy increased to \$2,500.00 per annum.—Such county assessor shall appoint and employ one chief deputy, who shall be paid a salary of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) per annum.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 474-H. F. No. 446.

An act to amend Section 824, General Statutes of 1913 as amended by Chapter 133, Session Laws of 1915, relating to the employment of deputies and clerks in the offices of county auditors in all counties in this state having a population of not less than 220,000 inhabitants and less than 300,000 inhabitants and to fix the salaries of county auditors, their deputies and clerks in such counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Increase of salaries of various employees in office of Ramsey county auditor.—That section 824, General Statutes of 1913 as amended by chapter 133, Session Laws of 1915 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 824. That in all counties in this state that now have or may hereafter have, according to last completed state or national census, a population in each of not less than two-hundred and twenty-thousand (220,000) inhabitants and less than three-hundred thousand (300,000) inhabitants, the salary of the county
