

CHAPTER 64—S. F. No. 170.

An act to legalize the bonds of any county heretofore issued for the purpose of obtaining money to pay for the repairing of a public ditch or ditches.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Certain public ditch bonds legalized.—In all cases where a county has heretofore issued its bonds for the purpose in whole or in part, of obtaining money to pay for the repairing of any public ditch or ditches, such bonds are hereby legalized and made valid and binding obligations of the county issuing the same.

Sec. 2. Application.—This act shall not apply to or effect any action now pending in which the validity of any such bonds is called in question.

CHAPTER 65—S. F. No. 219.

An act to amend Section 4892 of the General Statutes of 1913, as amended by Chapter 157 of the General Laws of 1915, relating to catching fish in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Spearing of rough fish between December 15 and March 1 permitted on securing licenses.—That section 4892 of the General Statutes of 1913, as amended by chapter 157 of the General Laws of 1915, be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 4892. No person shall catch, take or kill or attempt to catch, take or kill, any fish of any kind whatsoever, in or about any lake, lying wholly or partly in any of the counties of this state, to which this act shall apply, at any time, in any other manner than by angling for them with a hook and line held in the hand, or attached to a rod so held, nor with more than one line, nor with more than one bait attached thereto; *provided, that pickerel, red horse, suckers, carp and bullheads may be speared in a regularly licensed fish house between December 15 and March 1, following.*

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
