

with all other requirements for admission, be entitled to pursue any course or courses in the University of Minnesota or any state normal school, upon tuition provided by the state to an amount not to exceed \$200 for each person, provided that any such student may, at his option, enter any college or school in this state which maintained a student's army training corps unit in co-operation with the United States government, or any other college or school within the State of Minnesota approved by the state department of education, and his tuition therein to an extent not exceeding \$200 for each person, shall be paid by the state in accordance with the provisions of this act.

Provided, that any person who, at or prior to the time of his induction into the service of the United States of the kind defined in this act, was enrolled as a student in a college or school within the meaning of this act elsewhere in the United States may resume his study in such institution and receive the benefits of this act for the completion of his course.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 215—S. F. No. 300.

An act to amend Section 4445, General Statutes of Minnesota for 1913, relating to the storage and shipment of grain in terminal warehouses.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That Section 4445 of the General Statutes of Minnesota for 1913 be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 4445. **Schedule of Rates—Maximum Charges.**—"Every such warehouseman shall annually, during the first week in September, publish in some newspaper—daily if there be one—published in the place where his warehouse is situated, a schedule of storage rates for the ensuing year, which shall not be increased during such year, and no discrimination in rates shall be made by any such warehouseman. The charge for receiving, handling, storing and delivering grain at such warehouse shall not exceed one and one-half cents per bushel for the first fifteen days, or part thereof, and *one-thirtieth of a cent per bushel for each day, or part thereof, thereafter.*

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
