

CHAPTER 34—H. F. No. 95.

An act to validate and legalize certain warrants and orders issued by villages and townships of over seven thousand inhabitants.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. Certain village and Township warrants and orders legalized.—That all warrants and orders drawn and issued by any village or township in this state having more than seven thousand inhabitants upon any fund or by any department between January 1st, 1915 and January 1st, 1921, be and the same are hereby legalized and declared valid obligations of said village or township. Provided that the provisions of this act shall not apply to any action or proceeding now pending in any of the Courts of the State.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 35—S. F. No. 126.

An act to amend Sections 73, 75, 76, 77, 78, Chapter 400, Session Laws of 1919, relating to the preservation protection and propagation of wild animals, including quadrupeds birds and fish.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. That Section 73, Chapter 400, Session Laws of 1919 be amended so as to read as follows :

"Section 73. Pike and pickerel—Open season—Size—Limit—sale.—Wall-eyed pike (except sand pike) and pickerel, not less than 14 inches in length, may be taken by angling and thereafter possessed between May 15th and March 1st following, both inclusive. A person may take not to exceed 15 such pike or 25 such pickerel in one day. Wall-eyed pike, except those taken from waters which may be opened for the sale thereof by the commissioner, may not be bought or sold at any time. Pickerel may be taken by spearing except during the closed season therefor."

Sec. 2. That Section 75, Chapter 400, Session Laws of 1919 be amended so as to read as follows :

"Section 75. Crappies—Open season—Size—Limit—Sale.—Crappies not less than 7 inches in length, may be taken by angling and thereafter possessed between May 15th and March 1st following, both inclusive. A person may take not to exceed 20 crappies in one day. Such crappies, except those caught in waters closed for the sale thereof by the commissioner, may be bought and sold during the open season."

Sec. 3. That Section 76, Chapter 400, Session Laws of 1919 be amended so as to read as follows :
