Sec. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 503-S. F. No. 806.

An act to establish and create a public park to be known and designated as "Sleepy Eye Lake State Park," and authorizing the purchase and condemnation of land for park purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Sleepy Eye Lake State Park created.—That the following described premises situated in the County of Brown and State of Minnesota, shall be and hereby are set apart to be used perpetually as a public park, to-wit: All that part of Section thirty (30) in Township one hundred ten (110) of Range thirty-two (32)

contained within the line described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the west line of Grove Street in the City of Sleepy Eye five rods south of the high water shore line of Sleepy Eye Lake, thence south to the north line of Elm Street, thence west to the west end of Elm Street according to the now existing plat of said City, thence north to a point five rods south of the high water shore line of said Sleepy Eye Lake, thence in a northwesterly direction maintaining an approximate distance of five rods from the high water shore line of said lake to and around the west end of said lake, thence in a northeasterly direction at said approximate distance of five rods from the high water shore line of said lake to a point on Lot 1 of said Section thirty (30) opposite the west end of Lot 7 of said Section thirty (30), thence across the outlet of said lake to the west end of said Lot 7, thence in a southeasterly direction at said approximate distance from the high water shore line of said lake to the west line of Sixth Street in said City, thence south across the arm of said lake to a point five rods south of the high water shore line thereof, thence in a southwesterly direction at said approximate distance of five rods from the high water shore line of said lake to the point of beginning.

Sec. 2. Dedicated to people of Minnesota.—The name of said Park shall be "Sleepy Eye Lake State Park," and the same is by this act dedicated to the perpetual use of the people of the State of Minnesota, under the restrictions herein provided or which

may hereafter be provided by law.

Sec. 3. To be under care and supervision of State Auditor.

The general care and supervision of the Sleepy Eye Lake State Park, until otherwise provided for, shall be vested in the state auditor acting as state land commissioner.

Sec. 4. Attorney general to take steps to secure land in park limits.—The attorney general is hereby authorized and

directed to take all reasonable necessary steps to procure from the parties owning land within limits of said park, concessions to the state of Minnesota or conveyances thereto for park purposes and for such reasonable consideration as may be agreed upon, subject to the approval of the governor. In case any tract or parcel of land within the limits of said park cannot be secured upon satisfactory terms, the attorney general is hereby authorized to institute for and in behalf of the state proceedings in condemnation, as now provided by law, for condemning and converting private property within this state for public use. Whenever any proceedings in condemnation are had and taken for the condemnation and conversion of any of said lands, all of the provisions of an act approved March 9th, 1874, and entitled "An Act to provide for obtaining title to land, by the state of Minnesota for the use of the state" and all amendments thereto shall be applicable to all such proceedings, and all other provisions of law properly applicable, shall also be applicable to such proceedings.

Sec. 5. Penalties for cutting or mutilating trees, etc., in park.—Any person who shall wilfully cut, destroy or mutilate, or cause to be wilfully cut, destroyed or mutilated, any tree, shrub, timber, evergreen or plants of any kind, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof by any court having competent jurisdiction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, and not more than one hundred dollars for each offense, or to be imprisoned in the County Jail of Brown County, Minnesota, for not less than ten days or more than ninety days for each and every

offense.

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 504—S. F. No. 862.

An act to amend Section 1 of Chapter 30, Extra Session Laws 1919, entitled an act to amend subdivision 2 of Section 1, of Chapter 400, Laws 1913.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary of Supreme Court reporter.—That Section 1 of Chapter 30, Special Session Laws for the year 1919, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 1. That subdivision 2 of Section 1 of chapter 400, Laws of 1913, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

2. Chief Justice, seven thousand five hundred dollars; associate justice, seven thousand dollars each; supreme court commissioners, seven thousand dollars each; clerk of the supreme court, four thousand five hundred dollars; deputy clerk, two thousand
