or by confinement of not less than 15 days or more than 90 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 27. Same.-Any person who shall deface or alter any registration certificate or number plate or retain the same in his possession after the same has been defaced or altered shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 28. Invalidity of one part not to affect whole of actThe various provisions of this act shall be severable and if any part or provisions shall be held to he invalid it shall not be held to invalidate any other part or provision hereof.

Sec. 29. Date effective.-The tax imposed upon motor vehicles for the year 1923 shall be that specified by the provisions of Chapter 46I, Lazus 1921, and the amount of such tax shall not be changed or affected by any of the provisions of this act; but othervise this act shall take effect and be in force from and after July $1,1923$.

CHAPTER 419-H. F. No. 1370.
An act to amend Chapter 133 Lazus of Minnesota for the vear 1921, being "An act fixing and regulating the salarics, compensations, duties and help of certain county officials in counties having. or which may hereafter have, a population of 380,000 inhabitants or orer, and repealing all acts and parts of acts inconsistent therczuith."
Re it enacted hy the I.egislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Salaries of county officers in certain counties.That Chapter 133 Laws of Minnesota for the year 1921 entitled"An act fixing and regulating the salarics. compensation, duties and help of certain county officials in counties having. or which may hereafter have a population of 380,000 inhabitants or over, and repealing all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith",-be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Coroner.-The salary of the county coroner of each county of this state having, or which may hereafter have a population of 380,000 inhabitants or over, shall be forty-five hundred ( $\$ 4,500.00$ ) dollars per annum.

Sec. 2. Deputy coroner and assistants.-The county coroner of any such county shall appoint and employ two deputies who shall each be paid the sum of Sixteen hundred fifty ( $\$ 1,650.00$ ) dollars per annum; one deputy who shall be paid the sum of fiftecn hundred ( $\$ 1,500.00$ ) dollars per annum; and one secretary who shall be paid the sum of thirteen hundred tuenty ( $\$ 1,320.00$ ) dollars per annum; and said coroner, deputies and secretary shall be paid out of any moneys in the county treasury not otherwise appropriated, semi-monthly in the same manner as county officials are now paid, and the same shall be in full compensation for all services
rendered by said officers respectively in their general capacities. Said coroner may also appoint such additional deputies as in his judgment may be necessary for carrying on the work in said office, but such additional deputies shall be paid by the coroner out of the salary received by him as such coroner.

Sec. 3. Surveyor-The County Survevor in each county having, or which may hereafter have a population of 380,000 inhabitants or over, shall receive from such county a salary of four thousand ( $\$ 4,000,00$ ) dollars per annum for all services performeri by him for the county, and in addition thereto the County Surveyor shall be furnished with necessary transportation and be reimbursed for such other expenses as may be incurred by him in the performance of his duties.

Sec. 4. Deputies and assistants.-The County Surveyor may appoint and employ two deputies who shall each be paid the sum of taventy five hundred tzecnty (\$2.520.nn) dollars per annum: one chief clerk and draftsman who shall he paid the sum of fourtecn hundred thirty ( $\$ 1,4,30.00$ ) dollars per annum: one assistant engineer and roiman who shall be paid the sum of Fourtecn hundred thirty ( $\$ 1,430.00$ ) dollars per annum; two chain men who shall each be paid not to exceed the sum of Thirtecn hundred trienty ( $\$ 1.320 .00$ ) dollars per annum: two chain men for a period of six moniths each year. who shall each be paid not to exceed the sum of one hundred tcm ( $\$ 1 I_{i 0.00}$ ) per month; one mechanical engineer who shall be paid the sum of nineteen hundred cighty ( $\$ 1.980 .00$ ) dollars per annum. In addition such deputies shall be furnished such transportation as may be required in the performance of their official duties.

Sec. 5. Sheriff.-The salary of the sheriff of each county now having, or which may hereafter have a population of 380,000 inhabitants or over, shall be five thousand ( $\$ 5,000.00$ ) dollars per annum.

Sec. 6. The Sheriff shall also appoint and employ as many court room deputies as there are district court judges in and for said county. Said deputies shall attend the court of said judges and perform such duties pertaining to the sherriff's office as the sheriff may require; the compensation of each of said deputies shall be sixteen hundred and fifty ( $\$ 1,650.00$ ) dollars per annum.

An expense fund of two thousand ( $\$ 2,000.00$ ) dollars shall be set aside out of the first moneys received as fees from and after the passage of this act to be used by the sheriff to meet the current montlly expenses of the office, the moncy so useel to be replaced in said fund at the end of each month when such expense is allowed by the County Board.

Sec. 7. Auditor.-The salary of the County Auditor of each county now having, or which may hereafter have a population of 380,000 inhabitants or over, shall be five thousand ( $\$ 5,000.00$ ) dullars per annum.

Sec. 8. And provided further that wo such sums or any part thereof as herein provided. shall at any time he used to increase the salaries of any of the empleyes provided for in this act.

Sicc. 20. Stenographer for court commissioner.-The Court Commissioner of any county in this state now or hereafter having a population of 380.000 inhalitants or over, shall appoint and employ oue stenngrapher-clerk who shall he paid the sum of fourteen hיindred thirty (\$1.2,3non) dollars per annum.

Scc. 21. County board to employ additional help.-The Board of County Commissioners in cach combty now having or which may hereafter have a population of 380.000 inhabitants or over, shati have the prwer to appoint and employ such additional hely for the various county offices as to them may seem just and proper, and fix the compensation to be paid therefor.

Sec. 22. Salaries to be paid semi-monthly.-The salaries provided for in this act shall be paid semi-monthly.

Sec. 23. Invalidity of one section not to affect balance.If any section. clatse or part of this act shall be fround invalid, the validity of the remainder shall not in any wav be affected thereby.

Sec. 24. Employees not to engage in other occupations.-

No person holding any apprintive position whose salary is fixed by this act shall while employed hy any such connty, perform legal services or carry on any other gainful oecupation during office hours except for such county.

Sec. 25. Inconsistent acts repealed.-All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this statute are herely repealed.

Sec. 26. Effective April 1, 1928.-This act shall be in force

## CHAPTER 420-S. F. No. 2.

An act to amend Section 7933, General Statutes of Minnesota for the year 1913, relating to the lez'y on bulky articles of personal property, and changing the place where filing shall be made from the office of the clark of the town or municipality to the office of the city clerk of cities of the first class, in certain cases or of the register of deeds of the county.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Levy on bulky articles.--That Section 7933. General Statutes 1913 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
7933. When personal property, by reason of its bulk or other cause, cannot be immediately removed, it shall be a sufficient levy thereon if the officer, within three days thereafter, file with the city clerk if such property is situated reithin the limits of a city of the first class or zeith the register of deeds of the county in which the same is situated a certified copy of the execution, and of his return and levy thereon. The clerk of any such city of the first class or register of deeds shall endorse upon such copy the time of filing, and shall preserve the same, and make an entry in the chattel mortgage book, showing the names of the parties and the date of filing. He shall receive twenty-five cents for such service, which shall be paid by the officer and included in his charges.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
