

## CHAPTER 48—S. F. No. 271.

*An act to amend Section 6994, General Statutes 1913, relating to seed grain contracts.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Seed grain loans—Agreement—Contract.**—That Section 6994, General Statutes of Minnesota, 1913, be and the same is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 6994. To secure a loan or purchase of seeds, grain, or seed potatoes, the person receiving the same shall execute to the vendor or lender a note or contract containing a statement of the amount and kind of seed, and the terms of the agreement relative thereto. Upon filing the same or a copy thereof, as hereinafter provided, said vendor or lender shall have a lien on the crop grown therefrom.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 49—S. F. No. 93.

*An act authorizing certain counties to pay for the construction of county fair buildings in certain cases, and providing a tax levy therefor.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Re-imbusement of certain expenditures by agricultural societies in certain counties.**—That the board of county commissioners of any county in this state having not less than eighty-five (85) nor more than ninety-five (95) full or fractional townships and having an assessed valuation of not less than six million dollars nor more than twelve million dollars and which owns the fee simple title to land which has been and is being used for county fair purposes, is authorized to allow and pay, in its discretion, the whole or a portion of the unpaid balance now due and owing for permanent buildings for county fair purposes erected upon such land since the first day of May, 1921, and now standing thereon.

Sec. 2. **Tax levy authorized.**—That such board may, for the purpose aforesaid, annually levy, in addition to all other taxes, taxes in an amount not exceeding one mill on each dollar of the taxable valuation of such county.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
