

prior to June 30, 1927, make such agreement with banks or other corporations or persons as they may deem advisable or necessary to pay warrants issued against said revenue fund pursuant to any such appropriation prior to the time when the money to meet such appropriation comes into the state treasury, and whenever any warrants so issued are paid for the accommodation of the state the money necessary to pay interest upon the amounts of such warrants from the time when such payment was made until the money to redeem such warrants comes into the state treasury, at the rate agreed upon by the said governor, auditor and treasurer, is hereby appropriated.

CHAPTER 422—H. F. No. 1459

An act to appropriate money for expenses for the state government and for other purposes and prescribing present and future regulations and limitations relative to, the expenditure of certain portions thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
