in which the school funds of the state are required to be invested, and all securities taken upon such investments shall be deposited with the state treasurer; but in case of necessity such securities may be sold in order to raise money for current purposes. No such sale shall be made except by the unanimous vote of said board, such vote to be entered upon the records of its proceedings. All interest obtained from such investments shall be placed in the general fund, to be used for current purposes. A suitable office in the capitol, with suitable furniture and necessary office supplies, shall be provided by the proper state officer for the use of said board of trustees."

"2940. Annual meetings on second Saturday in September and compensation of members of board.—The board of trustees shall meet annually at the office of the secretary, in the State Capitol, on the second Saturday in September at an hour to be fixed by the board. Special meetings may be held at any time on the call of the president of said board or by any three members thereof. The state auditor, state superintendent of education and commissioner of insurance shall serve as members of said board without additional compensation, but the elective members of said board shall be entitled to compensation at the rate of five dollars per day and necessary expenses, while attending all meetings of said board, to be paid out of the insurance and retirement fund."

CHAPTER 164-H. F. No. 129

An act to amend Section 3862, General Statutes 1923, relating to the composition of the Board of Civil Service Examiners.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Civil service—Board of Examiners.—That Section 3862, General Statutes 1923, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"3862. To carry out the provisions of the preceding section of this act, a board of examiners is hereby created consisting of the state dairy and food commissioner, the dean of the agricultural college and the *Chief Oil Inspector*. In case of death or inability to act as one of three persons herein designated, the governor of the state shall appoint some person temporarily to act in his place. The state dairy and food commissioner shall be secretary of such board and shall keep all the records which shall contain all the proceed-

ings of the board in reference to examinations and of its actions in carrying out the provisions of this act. The secretary of the board shall likewise keep and have open to the inspection of the public, a list of the names of the persons who are eligible to appointment. Two members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. A chairman shall be elected by the board from its number. None of the members of the board shall receive any compensation for their services herein required, except their reasonable and necessary expenses, which shall be paid out of the fund appropriated for the maintenance of the state dairy and food department in the same manner as other charges against such fund are paid."

CHAPTER 165-H. F. No. 691

An act to amend General Statutes 1923, Section 3726, as amended by Laws 1927, Chapter 373, relating to the disposition and use of funds by relief associations and fire departments.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Disposition of such funds—Relief Association.—That General Statutes 1923, Section 3726, as amended by Laws 1927, Chapter 373, be amended so as to read as follows:
- "3726. Such amount shall be kept as a special fund, and disbursed only for the following purposes:
- (1) For the relief of sick, injured or disabled members of such fire department, their widows and orphans.
- (2) For the equipment and maintenance of such department and for construction, acquisition or repair of buildings, rooms and premises for fire department use or otherwise.
- (3) For the payment of the fees, dues and assessments in the Minnesota State Volunteer Firemen's Benefit Association so as to entitle the members of any fire department to membership in and benefits of such state association.

Provided, that the treasurer of the association may and shall loan or invest the funds of such association in such properties or securities as shall be directed by the trustees or board of managers of the association, but the said trustees or board of managers shall
