

"211. When a justice or commissioner of the Supreme Court or a judge of the District Court shall be retired under the provisions of Section 210, General Statutes 1923, as amended by Chapter 337, General Laws 1927, he shall receive the compensation allotted to his office for the remainder of his said term, or, if then past sixty-eight years of age, having served as a judge of the District Court and as a justice or commissioner of the Supreme Court, or in any one or more of such capacities, for more than twenty-three years, or if then past seventy-five years of age, having served as judge of the District Court for ten or more years and having served as member of Congress, and county attorney, or in any one or more of such capacities, an additional ten or more years, he shall receive *the compensation allotted to his office for the remainder of his said term and thereafter he shall receive* one-half of the compensation allotted to his office at the time of such retirement for the remainder of his life, to be paid at the time, and the manner provided by law.

CHAPTER 409—H. F. No. 1349

An act to appropriate money for state educational institutions, including university of Minnesota, university agricultural schools and experiment stations, and aids to high, graded, semi-graded and rural schools, prescribing present and future regulations and limitations relative to the expenditure of certain portions thereof, and conferring upon the board of regents of the University of Minnesota the power of eminent domain in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriations for educational purposes.—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act, to be available where not otherwise stated, for each of the fiscal years ending June 30, 1930, and June 30, 1931.

Sec. 2. State University, University Farm School and Experiment Schools and Stations:

1. For Maintenance and Special Equipment.....\$3,225,000.00

Provided that out of moneys appropriated by Item 1 hereof \$45,000.00 is hereby appropriated annually therefrom for maintenance and special equipment of the North Central School and Experiment Station at Grand Rapids.

Provided that the unexpended balance of the appropriation by item "1" of Section "7", Chapter 442, General Laws 1927, may at the discretion of the Board of Regents be used for repairs and alterations of buildings at the Northwest School and Experiment Station, Crookston.

Provided that the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota may use any money not specifically appropriated for other purposes, for acquiring land by purchase or condemnation. In case it is desired to use the fund for the acquisition of land, the power of eminent domain may be exercised either in accordance with Section 4085 to 4091, inclusive, General Statutes 1894, or Chapter 41 of the Revised Laws of 1905.

Sec. 3. Aids to schools:

1. For aid to high, graded, semi-graded, consolidated, industrial and rural schools to be distributed as provided by law, available for the year ending June 30, 1929\$5,600,000.00
2. For aid to high, graded, semi-graded, consolidated, industrial and rural schools to be distributed as provided by law, available for the year ending June 30, 1930\$5,610,000.00

Of the amounts specified in items 1 and 2 hereof no aid in the building or erection of consolidated rural schools shall be given in excess of \$3,000, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
