the commission deems proper in respect to legislation concerning any and every matter covered by said report.

Sec. 4. Appropriation.—There is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay all expenses incurred pursuant to this act. For the payment of such expenses the commission shall draw its warrants upon the state treasurer, which warrants shall be signed by the chairman or vice-chairman and attested by the secretary of the commission; and the state auditor shall then approve and the state treasurer shall pay such warrants as and when presented, but not exceeding in the aggregate the amount herein appropriated. A general summary or statement of expenses so incurred and paid shall be included in the above mentioned report of the commission to the legislature.

CHAPTER 419-S. F. No. 1460

An act to appropriate money for the payment of claims against the State of Minnesota; to provide for tax and other refundments; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of certain employes of the state having claims for personal injuries sustained or for loss or damage of property incurred while engaged in the performance of their duties and for the relief of dependents of certain employes of the state for the death of such employes while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of persons for injuries sustained or for loss or damage to property by certain employes of the state while engaged in the performance of their duties; and by inmates of state institutions: and for relief of dependents of certain employes of the state while engaged in the performance of their duties; and to provide for payments to certain persons for services performed to the state; to authorize the state auditor to cancel certain land and other contracts heretofore entered into by certain persons with the state and to credit payments heretofore made upon other purchases or to refund same; to reimburse certain persons for deeds to certain land erroneously conveyed by the state; to authorize the auditor to credit on certain land contracts the value of improvements found not to be on said land; to provide money for carrying on certain state activities as authorized by law; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of the game and fish department

funds; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of the rural credits department funds; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of the state agricultural society fund; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of the adjutant general's funds; and for other purposes out of other funds; and reappropriating certain balances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriation for miscellaneous claims.—The sums hereinafter named or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act to be available for the year ending June 30, 1939, unless otherwise specified.

CHAPTER 420-S. F. No. 1462

An act providing for the determination and payment of certain claims out of the Trunk Highway Fund or funds accredited thereto from highway patrol fines or other sources. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Waiver of immunity of estate.—That the State of Minnesota hereby waives immunity from suit for any damages for personal injuries and property damaged, caused by the location, relocation, construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance and supervision of the trunk highway system, to the claimants and in the amounts hereinafter designated.
- Sec. 2. Claimants may bring action within six months.—That said claimants may severally bring action against the State within six months from the date of enactment of this statute, notwithstanding any other statute of this State. Such actions shall be brought in the District Court in the county wherein such damage occurred. Service of summons shall be in accordance with Section 9230, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927. In case a judgment is rendered against the State, the Commissioner of Highways is requested and directed, upon receiving receipt and discharge of such judgment in full, to pay to the judgment creditor the amount of such judgment out of the trunk highway fund or out of funds accredited thereto from highway patrol fines or other sources.
- Sec. 3. Commissioner of highways may compromise claims.—The Commissioner of Highways is hereby authorized to pay, compromise, adjust or settle any or all of the respective claims herein referred to in any amount not to exceed the amounts respectively authorized herein out of the Trunk Highway Fund or out of funds accredited thereto from highway patrol fines, or other sources.
- Sec. 4. Names of claimants.—The respective names of each of said claimants and the amounts of said respective claims are as follows, to-wit:
