sin shall by law provide for similar restrictions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED By the Legislature of the state of Minnesota in regular session assembled, that the state of Minnesota memorialize the Senate of the state of Wisconsin, the Assembly of the state of Wisconsin and the governor thereof to provide during the present session of the Legislature of the state of Wisconsin restrictions for the taking of herring in the waters of Lake Superior similar to those provided by the legislature of Minnesota as above referred to.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the secretary of state is hereby instructed to forward to the Senate and Assembly of the Wisconsin Legislature and to the Governor of the state of Wisconsin, a duly authenticated copy of this joint resolution of the legislature.

RESOLUTION No. 20 (S. F. No. 622)

A concurrent resolution providing for the investigation and study by the Attorney General, of the question of the coordination and consolidation of all agencies of the state and within the state dealing with law enforcement and the apprehension of criminals.

Whereas, it is desirable and necessary for the best interests of the citizens of this State that there be close cooperation between the several law enforcement agencies of this State, so as to provide more efficiency in the enforcement of law and the apprehension of criminals; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and necessary that a careful study be made of the question of the coordination and consolidation of all agencies of and within the State dealing with law enforcement and the duties and responsibilities of such agencies;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved: That the Attorney General be and he is hereby authorized and requested to investigate and study the question of the coordination and consolidation of the several agencies of and within the State dealing with law enforcement and the apprehension of criminals, and to prepare and submit to the next session of the Legislature his findings and recommendations for such changes in the

laws of this State as will produce greater efficiency and cooperation between the several law enforcement agencies of and within the State and as will provide greater efficiency in the enforcement of law and the apprehension of criminals.

RESOLUTION No. 21 (S. F. No. 1273)

A concurrent resolution memorializing the Congress of the United States to pass legislation providing for cooperation by federal and state agencies as to the necessary surveys and investigations for the proposed Mississippi River Parkway.

WHEREAS, the Mississippi River for nearly four hundred years from the days of Indian Trails and discovery routes, has been used as a natural travel route of increasing historic, scenic and general importance; and

Whereas, interstate north and south travel-trade from the ten states bordering on the Mississippi River, containing approximately 30,000,000 people, constituting one-fourth of the population of the nation, with over 5,000,000 passenger automobiles, is continually increasing due to greater industrial leisure and tourist attractions; and

WHEREAS, the recent creation of splendid lakes by construction of 26 locks and dams on the upper Mississippi River, the modernization of the levees along the river, and the great variety of its climate, agricultural, mineral and industrial developments, provide greater nation-wide travel inducements than ever before along the Mississippi River; and

WHEREAS, the demands and needs for a national park and rural trunk parkway through the Mississippi Valley with connections for future branch tributary valley parkways and public areas for recreational purposes as a part of the nation-wide parkway system, justify the authorization of this particular parkway as timely; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed to construct this parkway from the source of the Mississippi River in Lake Itasca in Itasca State Park, Minnesota, to the mouth of the Mississippi in the Gulf of Mexico, and the State of Minnesota is, therefore, one of the terminals of the proposed parkway;

Now, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the state of Minnesota, the Senate concurring,
