is hereby authorized to offer for sale and to sell any and all platted tracts in the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter, section 9, township 162, range 38, which have forfeited to the state for taxes, and which are within the boundaries of the reforestration and flood control area created by Mason's Supplement 1940, Sections 6452-1 to 6452-10, inclusive, and 6452-12 and 6452-13, in the same manner as provided by law for the sale of agricultural tax forfeited land in said area, notwithstanding the fact that said platted tracts are classified as non-agricultural.

CHAPTER 358-H. F. No. 1456

An act to appropriate money for the current expenses, buildings and improvements at the state institutions, for expenses of the division of public institutions and certain activities under the supervision or control of said division, and for other purposes; to appropriate money from the state prison revolving fund for current expenses of the state prison; to authorize the transfer of funds in certain cases; and to authorize the commissioner of administration to make certain transfers from certain funds.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriations for state institutions.—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the general revenue fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to be expended by the Division of Public Institutions for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act, to be available at the time designated opposite each item.

Provided the above amounts are appropriated for the purpose of making available each year a sum sufficient to insure that the salary of no employee, in any of the institutions for which an appropriation is herein made, whose salary on the effective date of the Civil Service act was \$150.00 or less, per month, or who on said date had been in the continuous employ of the State of Minnesota for a period of five years, shall be lowered. Provided further that no salary of an employee in any of the institutions shall be less than \$60.00 per month.

Provided, that for the years ending June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, respectively, the Division of Public Institutions is authorized, by and with the approval of the State Auditor, to transfer in case of necessity a portion of the funds appropriated for the current expense of any one of the following institutions, namely: The Anoka State Hospital, the Moose Lake State Hospital, the Hastings State Hospital, the Willmar State Hospital, the Fergus Falls State Hospital, the Rochester State Hospital, the St. Peter State Hospital, the School for Feeble-Minded, the Colony for Epileptics, the School for the Blind, the School for the Deaf, the State Public School, the State Training School, the Home School for Girls, the State Reformatory, the State Reformatory for Women, the Sanatorium for Consumptives, and the Hospital for Crippled Children, to the use of any other of the aforesaid institutions; and

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Provided, further, that the Division of Public Institutions may, with the consent and approval of the Commissioner of Administration, transfer the balance of any appropriation made for a specific purpose at any institution to an account for any other specific purpose in and about such institution after the purpose for which such appropriation was made has been accomplished; and

Provided, further, that said Division of Public Institutions is hereby authorized and empowered to set aside a portion of the current expense fund of any such institution to be used as a diversified labor fund for the introduction and encouragement of such industries as in its judgment may be beneficial to the inmates of such institutions; and

Provided, further, that the amounts provided for each of the fiscal years for the emergency fund for state institutions as provided in this section shall be used exclusively for emergency purposes for current expenses and shall be authorized by the Commissioner of Administration after a full hearing and such amounts may be transferred only upon authority of the Commissioner of Administration to such institutions as provided in this act.

Sec. 22. Unobligated balances cancelled.—The unobligated balances on hand as of June 30, 1941, June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, in the several appropriations and accounts for each and all of the institutions named, the Division of Public Institutions and several divisions and activities of said division, for which an appropriation is made herein out of the general revenue fund, are hereby cancelled into said general revenue fund as of June 30, 1941, June 30, 1942, and June 30, 1943, together with any unobligated balance in the state institutions contingent fund of the Division of Public Institutions.

Sec. 23. Receipts deposited in general revenue fund.—Excepting the income from the Swamp Land Trust Fund, all receipts of said institutions and activities carried on under the direction of said Division of Public Institutions shall be deposited in and for the benefit of the general revenue fund, provided, however, that this shall not apply to revolving funds now established in said institutions for which no new appropriation is made out of the general revenue fund; and provided further that this shall not apply to money received in payment for the services of inmate labor employed in the industries carried on at the State Reformatory, State Reformatory for Women and State Prison, which receipts shall be credited to the current expense funds of said institutions.

Sec. 24. Division to negotiate with federal government for grants.—The Division of Public Institutions is authorized and directed to negotiate with the Federal Government, or any agency, bureau or department thereof, for the purpose of securing or obtaining any grants or aid in the construction of the buildings, or the making of the improvements, authorized by this act. Any grants or aid thus secured or received are hereby appropriated to said Division of Public Institutions and made available for the uses and purposes for which it was received and shall be used in conjunction with the appropriations hereinbefore provided.

CHAPTER 359-S. F. No. 111

An act to amend Mason's Supplement 1940, Section 3200-25, relating to the sale of intoxicating liquors. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Law amended.—Mason's Supplement 1940, Section 3200-25 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"3200-25. License-fruit juices-scope and grant of li-censes-carriers' licenses-off and on sale licenses-limitation of number of licenses-license fees-to whom paid-part of year.-That it shall be unlawful for any person, directly or indirectly, upon any pretense or by any device, to manufacture, import, sell, exchange, barter, dispose of or keep for sale, any intoxicating liquor, without first having obtained a license therefor, as herein provided. Nothing herein shall prohibit the natural fermentation of fruit juices in the home for family use. All manufacturer's and wholesaler's licenses shall include the right to import and shall be granted by the Liquor Control Commissioner. The business of manufacturer and wholesaler may be combined and carried on under one license issued therefor. All licenses for retail "Off Sale" shall be granted by the local governing body subject to the approval of the Liquor Control Commissioner and shall not become effective until so approved.

The Liquor Control Commissioner may issue a license or permit to any railroad company, dining car company, or sleeping car company, water transportation company or other common carrier operating in this state, to sell intoxicating
