CHAPTER 270-S. F. No. 326

An act relating to the payment of compensation of persons employed in state institutions who contract tuberculosis in such employment; amending Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 251.04.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 251.04, is amended to read as follows:

Employees in state institutions to be placed in sanatorium. If, upon the evidence produced at the hearing mentioned in section 246.29, the industrial commission finds that such employee is suffering from tuberculosis contracted in the institution by contact with tuberculous inmates therein, it shall order the director of the division of public institutions to apply for the admission of the employee to the state sanatorium for consumptives or some county tuberculosis sanatorium. The department of social security shall pay, out of funds heretofore or hereafter appropriated for aid to or maintenance of county tuberculosis sanatoria, to the state sanatorium for consumptives or the county tuberculosis sanatorium where the patient may be received, the same fee for the maintenance and care of such person as is received by the state sanatorium for consumptives or the county tuberculosis sanatorium for the maintenance and treatment of a non-resident patient. The industrial commission shall order payment to such employee from the state compensation revolving fund two-thirds of his salary not to exceed \$20 per week during the period of his disability, not to exceed 125 weeks. All such compensation payments made from the state. compensation revolving fund shall be reimbursed by the department of social security in the same manner as now required of other state departments by law.
