

## CHAPTER 442—H. F. No. 1393

[Not Coded]

*An act fixing and regulating the salary and compensation of stenographic reporters of the municipal court in each city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of 450,000 or more.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Compensation of stenographic reporters of municipal court of the city of Minneapolis.** The annual salary and compensation for stenographic reporters of the municipal court now fixed by law in each city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of 450,000 or more, shall remain as so fixed; except, that for the period commencing January 1, 1947, and continuing from year to year so long as the cost of living index for the city of Minneapolis (as determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor) remains above the figure 123.0 on the first day of January of each consecutive year, the salary and compensation of each such stenographic reporter shall be increased 14 per cent per annum.

**Sec. 2. Limitation.** Nothing herein contained shall inure to the benefit of any such official or employee whose salary may be affected by any other act enacted at the 1947 session of the Legislature.

## CHAPTER 443—H. F. No. 1394

*An act fixing and regulating the salary and compensation of judges, clerks, deputy clerks, and employees in the office of the clerk of municipal court in each city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of 450,000 or more.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Salary and compensation for judges, clerk, deputy clerks and employees of Minneapolis municipal court.** The annual salary and compensation for judges of the municipal court, clerk of municipal court, deputy clerks and employees in the office of the clerk of municipal court now fixed

by law in each city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of 450,000 or more, shall remain as so fixed; except, that for the period commencing January 1, 1947, and continuing from year to year so long as the cost of living index for the city of Minneapolis (as determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor) remains above the figure 123.0 on the first day of January of each consecutive year, the salary and compensation of each such official and employee shall be increased as follows:

Judges of Municipal Court.....	14 per cent per annum;
Clerk of Municipal Court.....	10 per cent per annum;
Chief Clerk .....	12 per cent per annum;
3 Assistant Chief Clerks.....	12½ per cent per annum;
Senior Deputies .....	14 per cent per annum;
Junior Deputies .....	20 per cent per annum.

Sec. 2. **Limitation.** Nothing herein contained shall inure to the benefit of any such official or employee whose salary may be affected by any other act enacted at the 1947 session of the legislature.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Salary and compensation for probation officers, assistants, and deputy probation officers of the Minneapolis municipal court.** The annual salary and compensation for probation officers, assistant probation officers, and deputies of the municipal court now fixed by law in each city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of 450,000 or more, shall remain as so fixed; except, that for the period commencing January 1, 1947, and continuing from year to year so long as the cost of living index for the city of
