village neglects to keep its streets, sidewalks, and alleys in repair;

- (6) Establish, maintain, and regulate the location of a public market or potato warehouse and market houses and provide for the use thereof:
- (7) Establish, maintain and regulate a public cannery and provide for the use thereof.

CHAPTER 457—H. F. No. 489 [Not Coded]

An act relating to the employment of deputies and clerical help by the sheriff and providing him with automobiles and equipment in counties having or which may hereafter have not less than 275,000 nor more than 375,000 inhabitants, and repealing Laws 1909, Chapter 361, Sections 2, 3, 4 and 5, as amended, Laws 1931, Chapter 258, as amended, and Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 387.28.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Sheriff's expense in certain counties. The sheriff in any county having or which may hereafter have not less than 275,000 nor more than 375,000 inhabitants shall appoint and employ one chief deputy, one chief criminal deputy and two assistants, ten court bailiffs, one chief patrol deputy and ten assistants, one female deputy, four process servers, one chief jailer and eight assistants, one matron and three assistants, one bookkeeper-cashier, one principal clerk, two clerk-stenographers and one senior clerk-typist. Five of said patrol deputies shall furnish their own automobile or motorcycle for the patroling of the county districts and shall receive the sum of \$35.00 per month for the care, maintenance and operation of said automobile or motorcycle. The titles herein mentioned shall not be controlling but shall be subject to change by the county board or other lawful authority.

Sec. 2. Purchase and upkeep of automobiles and equipment. Such sheriff shall be allowed a sum of not more than \$11,000 for the year 1948 and a sum of not more than \$10,000 per annum thereafter to be used for the purchase, care, maintenance, operation and upkeep of automobiles, insurance

including liability and property damage covering the operator of the automobiles, firearms and other necessary equipment and paraphernalia to be used in the performance of the duties pertaining to his office.

- Sec. 3. Repealer. Laws 1909, Chapter 361, Sections 2, 3, 4 and 5, as amended, Laws 1931, Chapter 258, as amended, and Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 387.28, are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 4. Effective date. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after January 1, 1947.

CHAPTER 458-H. F. No. 513

An act relating to fees of register of deeds in certain counties; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 357.18.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 357.18, is amended to read as follows:
- 357.18. Fees of register of deeds in certain counties. The fees to be charged and collected by the register of deeds may be, but not in excess of, the following:
- (1) For indexing and recording any deed or other instrument, ten cents per folio, to be paid when left for record;
 - (2) Every certificate, ten cents;
 - (3) Copies of any records or papers, ten cents per folio;
- (4) Recording any deed or other paper in other than the English language, 25 cents per folio;
- (5) Entering discharge of mortgage in the margin of the record, ten cents;
- (6) Filing every other paper, and entering the same when necessary, ten cents;
- (7) Searching for such paper on request, five cents for every paper examined;
 - (8) Searching the record, ten cents;
