An act to appropriate money for the salaries, current expenses, buildings and improvements at the state institutions, for the expenses of the Division of Public Institutions and certain activities under the supervision or control of said division, and for other purposes; and to appropriate money from the state prison revolving fund for salaries and current expenses of, and certain improvements at, the state prison; and creating a revolving fund at the state reformatory for men for the manufacture of license plates.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

State Institutions Appropriation Bill

Section 1. Appropriation to be expended by the Division of Public Institutions. The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the general revenue fund in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, or any other fund herein designated, to be expended by the Division of Public Institutions for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act, to be available for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1948, and June 30, 1949.

The unobligated balances on hand as of June 30, 1947, June 30, 1948, and June 30, 1949, in the several appropriations and accounts for each and all of the institutions named, the Division of Public Institutions and several divisions and activities of said division, for which an appropriation is herein made out of the general revenue fund, are hereby canceled into said general revenue fund as of June 30, 1947, June 30, 1948, and June 30, 1949, and the unobligated balances on hand as of June 30, 1948, and June 30, 1949, appropriated out of any other funds, shall be canceled into the fund from which they are appropriated as of June 30, 1948, and June 30, 1949. The provisions of this section shall not apply to aid, contributions, or reimbursements received from the Federal government by the state; and all such federal aid, contributions or reimbursements are hereby reappropriated

for the purpose of supplementing the appropriations herein provided.

Sec. 22. Receipts deposited in general revenue funds; exceptions. Excepting the income from Swamp Land Trust Fund, all receipts of said institutions and activities carried on under the direction of said Division of Public Institutions shall be deposited in and for the benefit of the general revenue fund, provided, however, that this shall not apply to revolving funds, now established in said institutions; and provided further that this shall not apply to money received in payment for the services of inmate labor employed in the industries carried on at the state-Reformatory, State Reformatory for Women and State Prison, which receipts shall be credited to the current expense funds of said institutions.

Sec. 23. Federal grant. The Division of Public Institutions is authorized and directed to negotiate with the Federal Government, or any agency, bureau or department thereof, for the purpose of securing or obtaining any grants or aid in the construction of buildings, or the making of the improvements authorized by this act. Any grants or aid thus secured or received are hereby appropriated to said Division of Public Institutions and made available for the uses and purposes for which it was received and shall be used in conjunction with the appropriations hereinbefore provided.

Sec. 24. Salaries. The amounts appropriated for salary increases herein are intended to constitute a maximum liability for that purpose in the various accounts for which such an appropriation is made, and the various officials are directed to permit salary increases in such manner that there shall be available sufficient funds for salary increase for each employee in each department in accordance with the law in relation to salary increases. Salary increases shall not be granted unless sufficient funds remain unobligated in the department by reason of previously granted salary increases, so that the liability for all salary increases, if they were all to be paid for a twelve months' period, would not exceed the funds provided for that purpose in this act.

Sec. 25. Budget requests submitted to Federal Government; submission to Commissioner of Administration. All state departments, bureaus, agencies, or divisions, operating under Laws 1939, Chapter 431, financed by funds appropriated or receipts or fees of any nature whatsoever, when making requests or preparing budgets to be submitted to the Federal Government in support of or in request of funds, equipment,

materials, or services, from the Federal Government, shall, upon completion of such request or budget, first submit it to the Commissioner of Administration. The Commissioner of Administration shall have authority to approve, disapprove, modify, or amend, any such request or budget before submitting it to the proper Federal authority. When such Federal authority has approved such request or budget, the State agency shall resubmit it to the Commissioner of Administration for recording before any allotment or encumbrance of the Federal funds can be made.

CHAPTER 583—S. F. No. 1380

An act relating to salaries and compensations of certain county officials in each county now or hereafter having a population of 500,000 or more; amending Laws 1945, Chapter 608, Section 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1945, Chapter 608, Section 1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. **Salaries of county officials in Hennepin County.** In each county of this state now or hereafter having a population of 500,000 or more, the county officials hereinafter named shall receive as full compensation for all services of every kind or nature performed as such officials whether pursuant to the laws of this state or of the United States, or of any home rule charter adopted pursuant to Article 4, Section 36, of the constitution of this state, stated annual salaries as follows, to-wit: county attorney, \$8,000; county auditor, \$6,250, and in addition thereto the county auditor may receive any sum not more than \$500 which may be otherwise provided for services as a member of a municipal building commission; county treasurer, \$6,750; register of deeds and registrar of titles, where the two offices are held by one person, \$6,750; county superintendent of schools, \$5,250; coroner, \$5,250, and the coroner and deputy coroners shall be reimbursed for the use of their own automobiles in the performance of their official duties, on a mileage basis at the rate fixed by law; clerk of the district court, \$6,750, but in case this act cannot
