

CHAPTER 48—S. F. No. 90

An act relating to the Minnesota Board of Examiners in Watchmaking; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 15.15.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 15.15, is amended to read as follows:

15.15. **No application to Board of Regents of Minnesota or certain examining and licensing boards.** The provisions and limitations of Laws 1939, Chapter 431, shall not be applicable to the regents of the university, nor to any persons, institutions, or employees under their jurisdiction, nor to the professional and regulatory examining and licensing boards enumerated in Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Chapter 35, the 1938 Supplement to Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Chapter 35, and *Laws 1943, Chapter 474*; provided, their books and accounts shall be subject to examination by the public examiner at any time, as in the case of other state agencies.

CHAPTER 49—S. F. No. 242

An act relating to the dissolution and liquidation of certain banking corporations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Dissolution and liquidation of certain banking corporations.** Any banking corporation which has transferred the substantial portion of its assets to another bank and which during ten years immediately prior to the enactment hereof (a) has not been actively engaged in the general banking business, and (b) has not been authorized by the Commissioner of Banks to engage in the banking business and has not had its certificate of authority to engage in the banking business, may be dissolved by proceedings in the District Court. This

act shall apply to any banking corporation otherwise qualified hereunder notwithstanding that the period for which such corporation was formed has terminated without extension.

Sec. 2. Proceedings under Chapter 301. All proceedings for dissolution of a corporation hereunder shall be the same as provided for the involuntary dissolution of Minnesota business corporations under Chapter 301, Minnesota Statutes 1945, insofar as the same may properly be applied thereto.

CHAPTER 50—S. F. No. 356

An act relating to compensation for Jurors serving in the municipal courts of certain cities.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. In any city of the second class operating under a special charter, the compensation to be paid jurors serving in the municipal court, shall be \$4.00 per day.

CHAPTER 51—S. F. No. 471

An act authorizing the renewal of the period of corporate existence of certain corporations whose period of duration has expired without renewal thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. **Renewal of corporate existence; county agricultural society.** Any county agricultural society, which is a member of the state agricultural society of the state, whose period of duration has expired less than ten years before the
