CHAPTER 517—S. F. No. 262

[Coded as Section 136.20.]

An act enabling the state teachers college board to permit a person or a corporation to conduct a book store in a college building and to allocate space therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

[136.20] Section 1. **Book store.** The State Teachers College Board may allocate space in a college building and permit a person or corporation to conduct a book store therein without rent during the pleasure of the board upon such conditions as may be imposed by the board.

CHAPTER 518—S. F. No. 263

[Coded as Section 136.171]

An act relating to summer sessions in state teachers colleges and reappropriating receipts.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

[136.171] Section 1. **Receipts from summer sessions and off-campus courses.** All receipts received by the state as a result of or because of conducting of summer sessions and off-campus courses during such summer sessions at the State Teachers' Colleges are hereby reappropriated to the respective colleges receiving such monies and shall be credited on the books of the State Auditor to be available during the fiscal year beginning July 1 during such summer session.

Sec. 2. **Effective date.** This act shall take effect July 1, 1949.

CHAPTER 519—S. F. No. 379

An act relating to compensation for election services; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 200.35, as amended by Laws 1947, Chapter 499.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 200.35, as amended by Laws 1947, Chapter 499, is amended to read:

200.35. Compensation for election services. The compensation for services performed under Chapters 200 to 212 shall be as follows:

(1) To presidential electors, \$10.00 for each day's attendance at the capitol, and five cents for each mile necessarily traveled in going to and returning from St. Paul;

(2) To persons carrying ballots from, and returns to, county auditor's offices, \$1.00 for each trip necessarily made, and five cents for each mile of necessary travel;

(3) To members of county canvassing boards, \$5.00 for each eight hours of service as members of such canvassing board, and five cents for each mile of necessary travel;

(4) To regular, special and ballot judges and clerks of election, not to exceed 75 cents for each hour necessarily spent in receiving votes *or* in counting and canvassing ballots; in the case of organized townships the compensation of judges and clerks shall be fixed at the annual meeting; in the case of unorganized territory by the county board; and in the case of *villages and boroughs*, by the governing bodies thereof, all subject to the limitations hereof; such compensation to regular, special and ballot judges and clerks of election in cities shall be fixed and determined by the council of such cities respectively; and
