Section 1. Laws 1951, Chapter 84, is amended to read:

Section 1. [614.575] Deafness, simulation a misdemeanor. Any person who, while peddling or begging, either simulates deafness or sells or distributes alphabet cards used by the deaf, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 311—H. F. No. 920

An act relating to wild animals and to licenses partaining thereto; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 98.47, Subdivision 1, as amended.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 98.47, Subdivision 1, as amended by Laws 1951, Chapter 164, is amended to read:

Exemptions to license requirements. 98.47 Residents under the age of 16 years may fish without procuring a license, and residents under the age of 16 may hunt small game and trap fur bearing animals except beaver or otter without procuring a license. Non-residents under the age of 16 years may take fish without procuring a license, if accompanied by a parent or legal guardian who has obtained a nonresident fishing license. Any non-resident under the age of 16 years who is attending a camp adjacent to any public waters of the state conducted by a social, charitable, or welfare organization or institution, not for profit, may take fish in such waters or other adjacent waters without procuring a license, provided the organization or institution conducting the camp shall have a certificate from the commissioner that the camp is qualified hereunder, describing the waters affected as determined by the commissioner, and each such non-resident shall carry with him at all times while taking or attempting to take fish in such waters a certificate identifying him and describing the waters, in such form as the commissioner shall prescribe, signed and dated by the officer or agent of the organization or institution

in charge of the camp within the current calendar year.

An act relating to road and bridge tax levies in certain counties; amending Laws 1951, Chapter 238, Section 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1951, Chapter 238, Section 1, is amended to read:

Section 1. In all counties having a population of not less than 28,000 nor more than 30,000 inhabitants according to the 1950 federal census and containing not less than 23 nor more than 25 full or fractional congressional townships, the county board at its July meeting may include in its annual levy not to exceed 20 mills for the county road and bridge fund. For the years 1954 and 1955 such counties may levy an additional five mills for the county road and bridge fund.

An act authorizing the renewal of the period of corporate existence of certain corporations whose period of duration has expired and legalizing acts and contracts of such corporations made, done, and performed subsequent to the expiration of the period of existence of such corporation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Renewal of corporate existence authorized; certain corporations. Any corporation organized under the provisions of Chapter 58 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota 1905 to acquire, hold, improve, and dispose of real estate situate within the county of its principal place of business for the purpose of encouraging and assisting in the location and establishment of manufacturing and other business enterprises in any city of such county and its immediate vicinity and for the purpose of providing sites for the plants of such manufacturing or business enterprises, whose period of duration has expired less than 20 years prior to the passage of this act and has not been
