#### CHAPTER 161-S. F. No. 419

An act relating to the salaries of the county commissioners of Anoka county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Anoka county, commissioners' salaries. The yearly salaries of each of the members of the board of county commissioners of Anoka county shall be set by said board at a sum not to exceed \$4,800, which sum shall be payable in equal monthly installments.
- Sec. 2. Anoka county, commissioners' expense. Each member of the board of county commissioners shall be allowed a sum not to exceed \$600 per year, which said sum shall be payable in equal monthly installments as and for expense account.
- Sec. 3. Salary in lieu of other allowances. The salary and expense provided in sections 1 and 2 shall be in lieu of all other emoluments, per diems, or mileage now allowed by law, except the per diem and expense allowed as a member of the Anoka county welfare board.
- Sec. 4. Validating effect. Payments heretofore made to the Anoka county commissioners are hereby validated.
- Sec. 5. Effective date. This act shall become effective only after its approval by a majority vote of the board of county commissioners of Anoka county, the effect of the act to be retroactive to January 1, 1963, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

# CHAPTER 162-S. F. No. 562

An act relating to Redwood county; providing for the salary of the county treasurer.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. County of Redwood, salary of county treasurer. The county board of the county of Redwood may fix the salary

of the county treasurer in an amount not to exceed \$7,000 per year. This amount does not include any fees, per diem, or other allowances to which the treasurer may be entitled by law in addition to his salary.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall become effective only after its approval by a majority of the members of the county board of the county of Redwood, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

#### CHAPTER 163—S. F. No. 640

### [Coded]

An act relating to counties; providing for the regulation and control of motor vehicles on parking facilities owned or operated by a county; providing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. [373.26] County parking facilities. Subdivision 1. No motor vehicle, either privately or publicly owned, may be parked upon any parking lot or facilities owned or operated by any county except as authorized by this act.
- Subd. 2. **Regulations by resolution.** The board of county commissioners of any county may regulate, by resolution, the parking of motor vehicles, either privately or publicly owned, including the authority to make charges for parking privileges, upon any parking lot or facility owned or operated by the county.
- Subd. 3. Enforcement. Regulations promulgated under the provisions of subdivision 2 shall be enforced by the county sheriff unless the county board has entered into a service contract for the enforcement thereof with the municipal council of the municipality in which the parking lot or facility is located.
- Subd. 4. Removal and impounding of vehicles. Any motor vehicle parked upon any parking lot or facility owned and operated by the county not in conformity with the resolution of the county board regulating the operation and use thereof may be deemed a public nuisance and the county board may provide for the abatement of such nuisance by resolution.
  - Subd. 5. Penalties. Any person, state, or county official,

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
