TRACT 1

All that part of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of section 12, T. 60 N., R. 22 W. of the 4th P.M., bounded by the water's edge of Beatrice Lake and the following described lines: Beginning at a point on the north line of said section 12, 668.0 ft. east of the north quarter corner thereof, and from which the north quarter corner of said section 12 bears N. 88°-54' W. from the point of beginning;

Thence S. 42°-36' W.—61.2 ft. -

Thence S. 47°-24' E.—50.0 ft. . .

Thence S. 87°-15' E.—255.0 ft. more or less to the water's edge of Beatrice Lake and there terminating; And from the point of beginning S. 88°-54' E.—303.2 ft. more or less along the north line of said section 12 to the water's edge of Beatrice Lake and there terminating; Including all riparian rights to the contained 0.6 acres more or less and subject to existing road easements.

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the moneys in the state treasury credited to the game and fish fund to be used to defray the cost and expense of the department of conservation in the acquisition, improvement, development and maintenance of sites for public access to public waters and for lake improvement, the sum of \$1,500 for the purposes of this act.

CHAPTER 762—H. F. No. 1672

An act appropriating moneys from the general revenue fund in the state treasury to the development revolving fund created by the Minnesota area redevelopment act and reappropriating moneys remaining therein or hereafter accruing thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Area redevelopment; appropriation.** In order to supplement the appropriations made by Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 472.13, and deposited to the credit of the development re-

volving fund created by the Minnesota area redevelopment act, there is appropriated to the development revolving fund in the state treasury the sum of \$750,000 from the general revenue fund in the state treasury. Any balance remaining in the development revolving fund on June 30, 1963, is hereby reappropriated. All funds appropriated to, or otherwise accruing to, the development revolving fund shall remain available until expended without further express appropriation.

CHAPTER 763—S. F. No. 1673

An act relating to the public employees retirement association; providing for certain members to obtain credit for certain time.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Public employees retirement association; special credits. Notwithstanding the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Chapter 353, and any act amendatory thereof, to the contrary, any former member who has allowable service credits covering the period July 1, 1932, through June 30, 1957, and the period from October 1, 1957, to the date of his retirement, may on or before September 1, 1963, obtain credit for allowable service for the period from July 1, 1957, and September 30, 1957, inclusive, by paying to the public employees retirement fund the aggregate amount of employee's and employer's contributions which would have been paid had such payments been made when due, together with interest thereon at the rate of four percent per annum compounded annually. If such payments and all other payments which may thereafter become due are made, the service of the former member from July 1, 1932, to the date of termination of his service is deemed to be, for purposes of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Chapter 352, one continuous period of service. The former member is entitled to all privileges, benefits, and rights, including options, to which any former member with a like period of continuous service is entitled.
