#### CHAPTER 804—S. F. No. 1858

#### [Not Coded]

An act relating to public buildings and public property of the state of Minnesota; authorizing the repair, maintenance, rehabilitation, and betterment thereof; appropriating certain moneys from the building outlay account in the state treasury therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. **Public buildings; repair, maintenance; appropriations.** Subdivision 1. There is hereby appropriated to the commissioner of administration and to the regents of the university of Minnesota, where so indicated, from the building outlay account in the state treasury the sums of money hereinafter set forth or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purposes stated in this act.
- Sec. 2. Subdivision 1. To the commissioner of administration to be expended for the purposes and in accordance with the provisions of this act:

#### CHAPTER 805-S. F. No. 1874

### [Not Coded]

An act fixing the salary of the mayor of the city of Minneapolis and providing that he deposit in the treasury of such city certain other income received by him as such official.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Minneapolis, city of; mayor's salary. Commencing July 1, 1963, the annual salary of the mayor of the city of Minneapolis shall be \$16,000, and shall be paid in the same manner as other salaries of the city.
- Sec. 2. Certain income to be deposited in city treasury. The mayor of the city of Minneapolis shall each month pay to the treasurer of the city of Minneapolis for deposit in the current expense fund of such city, all fees for attendance at meetings, or other compensation received by him from any board, commission or other body
