Subd. 10. State property; auction in lieu bids. The commissioner of administration in lieu of advertising for bids may sell buildings and other personal property owned by the state and not needed for public purposes at public auction to the highest responsible bidder. Such sale shall be made after publication of notice thereof in a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the property is located fer at least two successive weeks and such other advertising as the commissioner of administration may direct. Any of the property may be withdrawn from the sale prior to the completion of such sale unless the auction has been announced to be without reserve. If the sale is made at public auction a duly licensed auctioneer shall be retained to conduct such sale, his fees for such service to be paid from the proceeds, and there is appropriated from such proceeds an amount sufficient to pay such fees.

The commissioner may consign automobiles and trucks for sale at auction either to the general public or to licensed car dealers under such terms and conditions as are in the judgment of the commissioner most advantageous to the state.
