1.5	Section 1. SCHOOL FINANCE TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Recommendations and duties. The School Finance Task Force is
1.7	established to recommend to the Minnesota legislature changes designed to make Minnesota's
1.8	school finance formulas more equitable and efficient. The task force must publicly adopt
1.9	goals for Minnesota's funding system, identify specific formula changes to implement those
1.10	goals, and report on recommended changes to the Minnesota legislature. The task force
1.11	must examine funding for at least regular instruction, special education, and facilities. The
1.12	task force may also examine other areas of Minnesota's school funding system.
