## Sec. 2. APPROPRIATIONS.

- (a) \$1,000,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of human services in fiscal year 2015 for the safe harbor shelter and housing fund for housing and supportive services for youth who are sexually exploited.
- (b) \$1,500,000 in fiscal year 2015 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of health for grants for comprehensive services, including trauma-informed, culturally specific services, for youth who are sexually exploited.
