1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to capital investment; appropriating money for a child and adolescent
1.3 behavioral health facility in Willmar; authorizing the sale and issuance of state
1.4 bonds.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. **CHILD AND ADOLESCENT BEHAVIORAL HEALTH FACILITY;**
1.7 **WILLMAR.**

1.8 Subdivision 1. **Appropriation.** \$7,530,000 is appropriated from the bond proceeds fund
1.9 to the commissioner of administration to purchase land in or near the city of Willmar for,
1.10 and to predesign, design, construct, furnish, and equip, a 16-bed psychiatric hospital facility
1.11 of approximately 17,500 to 18,000 square feet that will house the Child and Adolescent
1.12 Behavioral Health Services (CABHS) program. The facility shall include space for single
1.13 bedrooms, bathing and toilets, dining, living, group, and treatment rooms, education space,
1.14 visitation, clinic/professional staff, operations staff, patient storage, operations storage, food
1.15 preparation, HVAC/telecommunications/data equipment, a small area for indoor recreation,
1.16 and a secure outdoor activity space. The property for the facility will provide for staff and
1.17 visitor parking, outdoor activities, and appropriate side, front, and rear setbacks.

1.18 Subd. 2. **Bond sale.** To provide the money appropriated in this section from the bond
1.19 proceeds fund, the commissioner of management and budget shall sell and issue bonds of
1.20 the state in an amount up to \$7,530,000 in the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect
1.21 prescribed by Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota
1.22 Constitution, article XI, sections 4 to 7.

1.23 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
