1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 121A.53, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 2. Report. (a) The school board must include state student identification
1.8	numbers of affected pupils on all dismissal reports required by the department. The
1.9	department must report annually to the commissioner summary data on the number of
1.10	dismissals by age, grade, gender, race, and special education status of the affected pupils.
1.11	All dismissal reports must be submitted through the department electronic reporting system.
1.12	(b) The school board must report through the department electronic reporting system
1.13	those school safety incidents where a student enrolled in the district physically attacks
1.14	or otherwise physically harms a teacher, administrator, or other school staff member. In
1.15	preparing the report, the teacher, administrator, or other school staff member and the
1.16	school board must consider what is developmentally and age appropriate for the student
