1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 97A.441, subdivision 5, is amended to read:
1.9	Subd. 5. Angling; disabled active duty members of the military and veterans. (a) A
1.10	person authorized to issue licenses must issue, without a fee, a permanent license to take
1.11	fish by angling to a resident who is a veteran, as defined in section 197.447, and that has a
1.12	100 percent service connected disability as defined by the United States Veterans
1.13	Administration upon being furnished satisfactory evidence currently in active military
1.14	service or who has been honorably discharged from active military service as evidenced by
1.15	the most recent form DD-214.
1.16	(b) A driver's license or Minnesota identification card bearing the designation under
1.17	section 171.07, subdivision 15, paragraph (a), clause (2), serves as satisfactory evidence to

3.14	persons hunting on their own property are not required to possess a stamp validation under
3.15	this section.
3.16	(c) Residents and nonresidents with licenses issued under section 97A.475, subdivision
3.17	2, clause (20); or 3, paragraph (a), clause (16), are not required to possess a stamp validation

3.20	Subd. 17. Disability designation. At the request of an applicant with permanent eligibility
3.21	for a disability designation and on payment of the required fee, the department shall issue,
3.22	renew, or reissue to the applicant a driver's license or Minnesota identification card bearing
3.23	a physical disability designation based on the following medical conditions condition:
3.24	(1) type 1, to an applicant who is permanently blind or disabled and meets the
3.25	requirements for a free license to take fish under section 97A.441, subdivision 1, paragraph
