Subd. 2. School officials required to report. A school official shall immediately report to the local police department or county sheriff all substantiated allegations of a crime of violence involving a student and occurring on school property.

Subd. 3. Immunity from liability. Any person reporting in good faith and exercising due care shall have immunity from any civil or criminal liability that otherwise might result by reason of the person's actions pursuant to this section. No cause of action

may be brought against any person for not making a report pursuant to this section.
