BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. [17.121] GRAIN STORAGE FACILITY SAFETY GRANT PROGRAM.
Subdivision 1. Protection equipment grants; eligibility. (a) The commissioner must
award cost-share grants to Minnesota farmers who purchase grain storage facility safety
protection equipment. Grants are limited to 75 percent of the farmer's documented cost to
purchase, ship, and install grain storage facility safety protection equipment or \$500,
whichever is less.
(b) Eligible grain storage facility safety protection equipment includes:
(1) fall protection systems;
(2) personal protective equipment to increase survivability in the event of a grain bin
related emergency;
(3) engineering controls to prevent contact with an auger or other moving parts; and
(4) other grain storage facility safety protection equipment approved by the commissioner.
Subd. 2. Grain silo air quality monitoring equipment. The commissioner must award
cost-share grants to Minnesota farmers who purchase grain silo air quality monitoring
equipment. Grants are limited to 75 percent of the farmer's documented cost to purchase,
ship, and install grain silo air quality monitoring equipment or \$500, whichever is less.
