BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this application is to be considered among the previously adopted balanced budget applications from other states, including but not limited to applications from the states of Alabama, Alaska, Arkansas, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, and West Virginia; and that this application is intended to be aggregated with the same for the purpose of attaining the two thirds of states necessary to require the calling of a convention by Congress for proposing a balanced budget amendment, but shall not be aggregated with any applications on any other subject.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this application constitutes a continuing application in accordance with Article V of the Constitution of the United States until the legislatures of at least two thirds of the several states have made applications on the same subject.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of State of Minnesota is directed to prepare copies of this resolution and is hereby directed to transmit it to the Speaker and the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, the President and the Secretary of the United States Senate, the United States Secretary of State, and Minnesota's Senators and Representatives in Congress, and to the presiding officers of each of the legislative houses in the several States, requesting their cooperation.
