1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7 1.8	Section 1. Laws 2021, First Special Session chapter 2, article 2, section 45, is amended to read:
1.9 1.10	Sec. 45. ASPIRING MINNESOTA TEACHERS OF COLOR SCHOLARSHIP PILOT PROGRAM.
1.11	Subdivision 1. Scholarship pilot program established. The commissioner must establish
1.12	a scholarship pilot program to support undergraduate and graduate students who are preparing
1.13	to become teachers, have demonstrated financial need, and belong to racial or ethnic groups
1.14	underrepresented in the state's teacher workforce.
1.15	Subd. 2. Eligibility. (a) To be eligible for a scholarship under this section, an applicant
1.16	must:
1.17	(1) either: (i) be admitted and enrolled in a teacher preparation program approved by
1.18	the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board and be seeking initial licensure;
1.19	or (ii) be enrolled in an eligible institution under Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.103, and
1.20	be completing a two-year program specifically designed to prepare early childhood educators
1.21	an associate's degree in early childhood education, education, or special education;

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(2) affirm to the teacher preparation program or the Office of Higher Education that the 2.1 applicant is a person of color or American Indian; 2.2 (3) be meeting satisfactory academic progress as defined under Minnesota Statutes, 2.3 section 136A.101, subdivision 10; and 2.4 2.5 (4) demonstrate financial need based on criteria developed by the commissioner. (b) An eligible applicant may receive a scholarship award more than once, but may 2.6 receive a total of no more than \$25,000 \$30,000 in scholarship awards from the program. 2.7 (c) An applicant may apply for both a scholarship under this section and an 2.8 underrepresented student teacher grant under Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.1274, but 2.9 may not receive an award from both programs during the same academic semester or term 2.10 unless there are sufficient funds appropriated to support all eligible applicants. 2.11 Subd. 3. Scholarship award amount. (a) The commissioner must establish a priority 2.12 application deadline and must give equal consideration to all eligible applicants regardless 2.13 of the applicant's attended institution or the order the application was received before the 2.14 priority application deadline. If the funds available for the program are insufficient to make 2.15 full awards to all eligible applicants who apply on or before the deadline, the commissioner 2.16 must make awards based on the expected family contribution Student Aid Index of an 2.17 applicant, prioritizing applicants with the lowest expected family contributions Student Aid 2.18 Indexes. If there are multiple complete applications with identical expected family 2.19 contributions Student Aid Indexes, awards must be randomly selected starting with those 2.20 applications may be prioritized by received by the priority application completion date 2.21

2.22 deadline established by the commissioner.

(b) For eligible applicants enrolled in a teacher preparation program as part of a 2.23 baccalaureate or postbaccalaureate degree program, the maximum award amount is \$10,000 2.24 per year for full-time study that may be used to defray a teacher candidate's overall cost of 2.25 attendance as determined by their attended institution. For eligible applicants enrolled in 2.26 an associate's degree program, the maximum award amount is \$6,000 per year for full-time 2.27 study. For undergraduate students, full-time study means enrollment in a minimum of 15 2.28 12 or more credits per term. For graduate students, full-time study means enrollment in a 2.29 minimum of six graduate credits or the equivalent. 2.30

(c) If an eligible applicant is enrolled <u>full time in a program for only one term during</u>
the academic year, the <u>applicant may receive no more than half of the applicable maximum</u>
award amount is \$5,000. If an eligible applicant is enrolled <u>part less than full time</u>, the award
amount must be prorated on a per-credit basis.

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3.1 (d) Subject to the funds available for the program, and subject to the limitation in
3.2 paragraph (e), the minimum award amount established under this section for full-time study
3.3 must be no less than \$1,000 per year.

(e) An eligible applicant's individual award amount must not exceed the applicant's cost
of attendance after deducting: (1) the student's <u>expected family contribution Student Aid</u>
<u>Index;</u> (2) the sum of all state or federal grants and gift aid received, including a Pell Grant
and state <u>grant grants;</u> (3) the sum of all institutional grants, scholarships, tuition waivers,
and tuition remission amounts; and (4) the amount of any private grants or scholarships.

(f) Awards are made until available funds are expended. Eligible applicants who
completed their applications on or before the priority application deadline but who did not
receive an award due to insufficient funds, and eligible applicants who completed their
applications after the priority application deadline, shall be placed on an award waiting list
by order of application completion date.

3.14 Subd. 4. Administration. (a) The commissioner must establish an application process
3.15 for individual students and institutions on behalf of all eligible students at the institution
3.16 and other guidelines for implementing the scholarship program.

3.17 (b) A scholarship award must be paid to the eligible applicant's teacher preparation
3.18 institution on behalf of the eligible applicant. Awards may be paid only when the institution
3.19 has confirmed to the commissioner the applicant's name, racial or ethnic identity, gender,
3.20 licensure area sought, and enrollment status.

3.21 Subd. 4a. Account established. An aspiring Minnesota teachers of color scholarship
3.22 program account is created in the special revenue fund for depositing money appropriated
3.23 to or received by the commissioner for the program. Money deposited in the account is
3.24 appropriated to the commissioner, does not cancel, and is continuously available for
3.25 scholarship awards under this section.

3.26 Subd. 5. Service expectation. An applicant who receives a scholarship under this section
3.27 is expected to serve as a full-time teacher in Minnesota after completing the program for
3.28 which the scholarship was awarded.

3.29 Subd. 6. **Report.** By December 15 of each year, the commissioner must submit a full 3.30 report on the details of the scholarship program for the previous fiscal year to the legislative 3.31 committees with jurisdiction over E-12 and higher education finance and policy. The reports 3.32 must also be made available on the Office of Higher Education's website. The reports must 3.33 include the following information:
