1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to public health; terminating a declared peacetime emergency; extending
1.3 certain executive orders; providing additional measures to protect public health.

1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5 Section 1. PEACETIME EMERGENCY TERMINATION; EXECUTIVE ORDERS
1.6 EXTENDED.

1.7 Subdivision 1. Peacetime emergency terminated. The house of representatives and
1.8 the senate of the state of Minnesota exercise the powers granted to the legislature under
1.9 Minnesota Statutes, section 12.31, subdivision 2, paragraph (b), to terminate the governor's
1.10 peacetime emergency declared in Executive Order 20-01 on March 13, 2020, and extended
1.11 in Executive Order 20-35 on April 13, 2020.

1.12 Subd. 2. Extension; certain executive orders. In order to ensure a seamless transition
1.13 to a nonemergency status and to protect the health, welfare, and well-being of the public:

1.14 (1) Executive Orders 20-02, 20-03, 20-06, 20-07, 20-10, 20-13, 20-16, 20-19, 20-21,
1.15 20-22, 20-23, 20-24, 20-25, 20-26, 20-27, 20-28, 20-29, 20-31, 20-34, and 20-36 remain
1.16 in effect until rescinded by the legislature;

1.17 (2) any provision in Laws 2020, chapters 71 and 74, that is dependent on a peacetime
1.18 emergency declaration is continued; and

1.19 (3) the following response measures apply with respect to the COVID-19 outbreak:

1.20 (i) the most vulnerable Minnesotans, as defined in the Department of Health's April 10,
1.21 2020, SARS-CoV-2 modeling version 2.0, must continue to observe stay-at-home practices

2.1 for ten weeks from the date this section is effective or 30 days after the date of peak deaths
2.2 in Minnesota, whichever is sooner;

2.3 (ii) Minnesotans that are not included in the definition of most vulnerable must practice
2.4 physical distancing, as defined in the Department of Health's April 10, 2020, SARS-CoV-2
2.5 modeling version 2.0, for 21 days after the date this section is effective; and

2.6 (iii) all Minnesotans are encouraged to comply with social distancing guidelines.

2.7 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** (a) Subdivision 1 is effective the day after this act receives a
2.8 majority vote of each house of the legislature, as provided in Minnesota Statutes, section
2.9 12.31, subdivision 2, paragraph (b).

2.10 (b) Subdivision 2 is effective the day following final enactment.
