1.5	Section 1. MEAT CUTTING GRANTS; APPROPRIATION.
1.6	(a) \$375,000 in fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the workforce development fund
1.7	to the commissioner of employment and economic development to provide grants to
1.8	secondary career and technical education programs for the purpose of offering instruction
1.9	in meat cutting and butchery. This is a onetime appropriation. Notwithstanding Minnesota
1.10	Statutes, section 16A.28, any unencumbered balance does not cancel at the end of fiscal
1.11	year 2024 and is available in fiscal year 2025. Grants may be used for costs, including but
1.12	not limited to:
1.13	(1) equipment required for a meat cutting program;
1.14	(2) facility renovation to accommodate meat cutting; and
1.15	(3) training faculty to teach the fundamentals of meat processing.
1.16	(b) A grant recipient may be awarded a grant of up to \$75,000 and may use up to ten
