1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 244.09, subdivision 14, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 14. Report on mandatory minimum sentences. (a) The Sentencing Guidelines
1.9	Commission shall include in its annual report to the legislature a summary and analysis of
1.10	reports received from county attorneys under section 609.11, subdivision 10.
1.11	(b) For offenses listed in section 609.11, subdivision 9, where the mandatory minimum
1.12	sentence was not imposed, the summary and analysis required under paragraph (a) must
1.13	include:
1.14	(1) the name of the offender;
1.15	(2) a description of the facts of the case;
1.16	(3) the applicable mandatory minimum sentence;
1.17	(4) the sentence imposed;
1.18	(5) whether the sentence was stayed or executed and, if stayed, the length of probation
1.19	ordered;
1.20	(6) the name of the judge;
1.21	(7) the name of the chief prosecutor; and

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- 2.1 (8) the person who recommended the reduced sentence.
- 2.2 (c) The information required under paragraph (b) must be made publicly available on

the website of the Sentencing Guidelines Commission.
