Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 461.12, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. Administrative penalties; licensees. (a) If a licensee or employee of a licensee sells tobacco or tobacco-related devices to a person under the age of 18 years, or violates any other provision of this chapter, the licensee shall be charged an administrative penalty of \$75. An administrative penalty of \$200 must be imposed for a second violation at the same location within 24 months after the initial violation. For a third violation at the same location within 24 months after the initial violation, an administrative penalty of \$250 must be imposed, and the licensee's authority to sell tobacco at that location must be suspended for not less than seven days.

(b) No suspension or penalty may take effect until the licensee has received notice, served personally or by mail, of the alleged violation and an opportunity for a hearing before a person authorized by the licensing authority to conduct the hearing. A decision that a violation has occurred must be in writing.

(c) In lieu of the license suspension provisions of this subdivision or a similar local ordinance, the licensing authority may take any alternative, authorized enforcement action that the authority deems fit if it determines that the violation was caused by a sincere mistake made by an employee of the licensee. Prior to making a determination to take alternative enforcement action, the licensing authority shall consider whether or not the
