Sec. 2. EARLY DENTAL PREVENTION PILOT PROGRAM.

(a) The commissioner of health shall develop and implement a pilot program to increase 2.5 awareness and encourage early preventive dental intervention for infants and toddlers. The 2.6 commissioner shall award grants to five designated communities of color or recent 2.7 immigrants to participate in the pilot program, with at least two designated communities 2.8 2.9 located in the nonmetropolitan area. (b) The commissioner, in consultation with members of the designated communities, 2.10 2.11 shall distribute or cause to be distributed the educational materials and information developed under Minnesota Statutes, section 144.061, to expectant and new parents within the 2.12 designated communities, including, but not limited to, making the materials available to 2.13 health care providers, community clinics, WIC sites, and other relevant sites within the 2.14 designated communities through a variety of communicative means, including oral, visual, 2.15 2.16 audio, and print. (c) The commissioner shall work with members of each designated community to ensure 2.17 that the educational materials and information are distributed. The commissioner shall assist 2.18 the designated community with developing strategies, including outreach through ethnic 2.19 radio, webcasts, and local cable programs, and incentives to encourage and provide early 2.20 preventive dental intervention and care for infants and toddlers that are geared toward the 2.21 ethnic groups residing in the designated community. 2.22 (d) The commissioner shall develop measurable outcomes, establish a baseline 2.23 measurement, and evaluate performance within each designated community in order to 2.24 2.25 measure whether the educational materials, information, strategies, and incentives increased the numbers of infants and toddlers receiving early preventive dental intervention and care. 2.26 (e) By March 15, 2019, the commissioner shall submit a report to the chairs and ranking 2.27 minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over health care.
