BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

## Section 1. [116.062] AIR TOXICS EMISSIONS REPORTING.

- (a) The commissioner must require a facility operating under an air quality permit issued 17 by the agency to annually report the facility's air toxics emissions to the agency, including 1.8 a facility not required as a condition of its air quality permit to keep records of air toxics 1.9 emissions. The commissioner must determine the method to be used by a facility to directly 1.10 measure or estimate air toxics emissions. The commissioner must incorporate the requirement 1.11 to annually report air toxics emissions into the air quality permit of each facility subject to 1.12 this section. 1.13
  - (b) For the purposes of this section, "air toxics" means chemical compounds or compound classes that are emitted into the air by a permitted facility and that are:
- (1) hazardous air pollutants listed under the federal Clean Air Act, United States Code, 1.16 title 42, section 7412, as amended; 1.17
- (2) chemicals reported as released into the atmosphere by a facility located in the state 1.18 for the Toxic Release Inventory under the federal Emergency Planning and Community 1.19 Right-to-Know Act, United States Code, title 42, section 11023, as amended; 1.20
- (3) chemicals of high concern, as listed by the Department of Health under section 1.21 116.9402; 1.22
