Section 1. Laws 2021, First Special Session chapter 7, article 17, section 20, is amended 1.7 to read:

Sec. 20. HCBS WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT GRANT.

- Subdivision 1. Appropriation. (a) This act includes \$0 in fiscal year 2022 and \$5,588,000 1.10 in fiscal year 2023 to address challenges related to attracting and maintaining direct care 1.11 workers who provide home and community-based services for people with disabilities and 1.12 older adults. The general fund base included in this act for this purpose is \$5,588,000 in 1.13 fiscal year 2024 and \$0 in fiscal year 2025. 1.14
 - (b) At least 90 percent of funding for this provision must be directed to workers who earn 200 300 percent or less of the most current federal poverty level issued by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
 - (c) The commissioner must consult with stakeholders to finalize a report detailing the final plan for use of the funds. The commissioner must publish the report by March 1, 2022, and notify the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over health and human services policy and finance.
