1.5	Section 1. HEALTH AND CLIMATE RESILIENCY COMMISSION.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. A Health and Climate Resiliency Commission is created.
1.7	Subd. 2. Voting membership. (a) The voting members of the commission are:
1.8	(1) the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with
1.9	jurisdiction over agriculture finance, or the chair's designee;
1.10	(2) the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with
1.11	jurisdiction over E-12 education finance, or the chair's designee;
1.12	(3) the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with
1.13	jurisdiction over health and human services finance, or the chair's designee;
1.14	(4) the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with
1.15	jurisdiction over environment and natural resource finance, or the chair's designee;

	Subd. 6. Powers. To accomplish its duties under this section, the commission may:
	(1) hold one or more public hearings;
	(2) request and receive information from any state or local governmental entity or
inst	itution, including academic reports; and
	(3) authorize studies and reports related to health and climate change consequences or
oen	efits, including economic impact studies.
	Subd. 7. Staff. The Legislative Coordinating Commission must employ staff or contract
wit	h consultants as necessary to enable the commission to carry out its duties and functions.
	Subd. 8. Compensation. Voting members of the commission may receive per diem and
exp	ense reimbursement incurred while doing the work of the commission in the manner
and	amount prescribed for per diem and expense payments by the senate Committee on
Rul	es and Administration and the house of representatives Committee on Rules and
Leg	gislative Administration.
	Subd. 9. Report. No later than January 15, 2018, the commission must submit the
<u>stra</u>	tegic plan required under this section to the governor and the legislature along with any
reco	ommended legislation.
	Subd. 10. Expiration. This section expires January 30, 2018.

	\$ in fiscal year 2018 is appropriated from the general fund to the Legislative
Coc	ordinating Commission for purposes of this act.

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
