1.1 A resolution

memorializing the United States Secretary of Interior to designate the Coldwater Springs area as a traditional cultural property.

WHEREAS, Coldwater Springs is a 10,000 year old spring located halfway between the confluence of the Mississippi and Minnesota Rivers and Minnehaha Falls, atop of the Mississippi Gorge, the only true river gorge on the Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the Coldwater Springs area is historically significant as a Native American ceremonial site and cultural trading center of the Dakota, Ojibwe, Sauk and Fox, and Iowa peoples because of its location above the confluence of the Minnesota and Mississippi Rivers, which served as an original intercontinental "highway" carrying trade from the native North American Indian nations to South American Indian nations for thousands of years; and

WHEREAS, traditional cultural properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places are entitled to identification, documentation, preservation, and protection by the United States Secretary of the Interior through the National Park Service, the State Historic Preservation Office, the Minnesota Department of Transportation, and other related state and federal agencies; and

WHEREAS, Coldwater Springs is considered the last remaining major natural freshwater spring in Hennepin County still flowing at 90,000 gallons per day, is the traditional place native people can go to collect sacred spring water essential for ceremonies, and should be protected as a matter of freedom of religion; and

WHEREAS, Coldwater Springs furnished water to Fort Snelling from 1820 to 1900 where Dred Scott was stationed and where he met and married his wife Harriet, and Dred Scott based his case for freedom from slavery in part on his residency in the "free Wisconsin territory"; and
